The event was at the 18th Annual Sky Ball sponsored by the Airpower Foundation and American Airlines. The event raised \$2.75 Million for Military! The gift was a POW military diorama depicting a POW compound with a bamboo frame. The flight helmet was a Vietnam era flight helmet decorated with the 4th Allied POW Wing logo.
